Marketing Your Program

In Tough Economic Times

Wyoming is blessed to have an economy stronger than many other states but even here, we are feeling the pain. Last year, 117 child care providers closed their doors.

While we can't cure the economy, we here at CCF can help you market your child care business. In 2010, we will introduce "Provider Profiles" a new service to help attract parents who search for care through our on-line service.

A Provider Profile can show as little or as much as you want parents to see about your child care business. You can post pictures of yourself and your classrooms and play areas. You can tell parents about your background, education, certifications and accreditations. You can list your rates, your vacancies, your hours and other important information. Your Provider Profile can be the best first impression you can make with parents.

Your Marketing Plan

Would you like to increase enrollment? Offer a new service? Build a waiting list? A well thought out marketing plan will give you a step by step strategy to reach those goals.

First, consider what makes your child care business unique and special. What sets you apart and makes parents choose you to care for their child? These strengths need to be featured in your marketing efforts. If you aren't sure, don't be afraid to ask!

Second, develop word of mouth referrals by building strong relationships with parents, families and your community. Parents listen to other parents so encourage them to pass your name along to their friends and co-workers.

Third, target your message to get the biggest bang for your marketing dollar. Consider advertising in libraries, medical offices and community events geared to families with young children.

Finally, make a great first impression. Right or wrong, parents make up their minds about your program within ten minutes of walking through the door. From the first phone call to the parent tour, make sure you are demonstrating to each parent why they can trust you with their child.
